What is a POiNTgroup?

POiNTgroups are small gatherings of people (Christian and non) that meet regularly for friendship, accountability, study, prayer, laughter, and occasionally tears. With one of our Core Values being *"intimately gathering in small groups around the city for support and encouragement,"* these groups are at the heart of C!C. Each group is unique, shaped by its neighborhood and the people who attend. However, you can expect a weekly gathering in a residence that involves food, conversation, prayer, discussion for applying the Bible to practical living, and service in the neighborhood. These groups are a "focal point" of discipleship, and "exclamation point" of fellowship, and a "launching point" for ministry. Central to each of these groups is the desire to see an authentic community marked by love for Jesus, one another, and the neighborhood.

Why should I join a POiNTgroup?

The God of the Bible is a Trinitarian God who is one and three persons: Father, Son, and Spirit. God has made us in his image, which means we are made for community and friendship. And when we are not living in community we suffer because life in a sinful world is too complex and tempting to journey alone. Therefore, community groups are a place where we can live in relationship with one another through the ups and downs of life.

How do I get connected to a POiNTgroup?

The easiest way to get connected is on Sunday: before or after the service, grab someone from the Pastoral Team or ask anyone if they are in a group. The team will personally walk you through the process and connect you to a group. You can begin participating in the community of Celebration! at any time, and we are glad to welcome you.
